10.00 – 10.20h Key Note speaker: Edit Schlaffer

Edith Schlaffer is a social scientist, founder of the Viennabased NGO "<u>Women without Borders</u>" (SAVE) and founder of the "Mothers' Schools" model (weekly training meetings, run by female community leaders, empowering mothers to safeguard the young from the threat of violent extremism and the lure of radicalization). She was also participant at the "White House Summit on Countering Violent Extremism" (February 2015).

Edit Schlaffer will outline the challenges the international community is facing due to radicalization from a scientific point of view. She will outline how the phenomenon endangers local societies as well as those abroad and how it harms entire families. She will also present field research results on countering radicalization.

10.35 – 12.00h European efforts in Counter-Terrorism:

This part of Session I intents to collect information on communication strategies of the EU Member States on Counter-Terrorism. Due to the convenience, affordability and broad reach of platforms such as YouTube, Facebook and Twitter, terrorist groups have increasingly used social media to further their goals and spread their message.

The session will discuss best practices on how to counter radicalization and violent extremism by strategic communication, taking examples such as the French "#stopdjihadisme" (Link: http://www.stopinitiative djihadisme.gouv.fr/) or the EU Radicalisation Awareness Network (RAN; Link: http://ec.europa.eu/dgs/homeaffairs/what-wedo/networks/radicalisation awareness network/aboutran/index_en.htm).

We will also learn about the attempts that have recently been made by the Council and the Commission to thwart the use of Social Media by terrorist organizations and to develop counter-narratives to terrorist propaganda.

Session II will focus on governmental crisis communication and on the specific challenges that interaction through online platforms poses to deciders (accuracy, trustworthiness and quickness of communication flows in times of crisis).

- The first aim is to gather information and to discuss the EU Member States' experiences in using Social Media for crisis communication: Is Social Media part of an integrated governmental crisis strategy? And if yes, how is it incorporated into the crisis communication strategy?
- The second aim of the session is to learn about the internal organizational structures in the EU Member States: Who is in charge of crisis communication? How is staff being trained to "be prepared for the unpreparable"? etc. This aim will be mainly achieved by a questionnaire
